“Avoiding shipwreck”- Good Conscience- 2

**1 Timothy 1:18,19 NKJV** “*This <sup>[1]</sup>charge I **commit to you**, son Timothy, according to the prophecies previously made concerning you, **that by them you may wage the good warfare,** <sup>19</sup> having faith and a good conscience, which some having rejected, concerning the faith **have suffered shipwreck.***”

- The rejected the prophesies; faith, and a good conscience

2024- “its is vital, it is necessary, to **stay in faith, remain focused on the promises of God** and don’t let anything that is happening in the world to **distract you**”

- “if they follow those instruction then it will be a year of progression, advancement, promotion, and a year in which their highest expectations fulfilled”
- “- immerse yourself in this and answers will emerge”

### **HOLD ONTO OUR FAITH!**

**Hebrews 10:23-25 NKJV** “*Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful. <sup>24</sup> And let us consider one another in order to stir up love and good works, <sup>25</sup> **not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together,** as is the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much the more as you see the Day approaching...*

**35-39** “*Therefore do not cast away your confidence, which has great reward. <sup>36</sup> For you have need of endurance, so that after you have done the will of God, you may receive the promise: <sup>37</sup> “For yet a little while, And He<sup>[1]</sup> who is coming will come and will not<sup>[1]</sup>tarry.<sup>38</sup> Now **the<sup>[1]</sup> just shall live by faith;** But if anyone draws back, My soul has no pleasure in him.”<sup>39</sup> But we are not of those who draw back to <sup>[1]</sup>perdition, but of those who believe to the saving of the soul.”*

God wants us to hold onto our faith! Faith to faith, glory to glory! (Dr. Savelle)

**A GOOD CONSCIENCE-** this helps us stay steady.

When our conscience is good then our attitude stays good. A good conscience helps us stay grounded in faith. A good conscience keeps us free of guilt, condemnation and keeps us doing good.

When we put away our good conscience a persons faith will go shipwreck. People think they can play both sides of the fence and walk in power and it doesn't work that way. (**Remember, we are avoiding shipwreck**)

The battle is real and with the help of the Holy Spirit we can win over the battles of alcohol, lust, drugs, deception, shipwreck etc...

If we miss it or when we miss it, God is merciful and gracious and we can get it right. We can receive forgiveness get back in the game and make progress, advance, walk in promotion and keep expecting the goodness of God in our lives.

**John 8:2-11 NKJV** “Now <sup>1</sup>early in the morning He came again into the temple, and all the people came to Him; and He sat down and taught them. <sup>3</sup> Then the scribes and Pharisees brought to Him a woman caught in adultery. And when they had set her in the midst, <sup>4</sup> they said to Him, “Teacher, <sup>4</sup> this woman was caught in adultery, in the very act. <sup>5</sup> Now <sup>5</sup> Moses, in the law, commanded us <sup>5</sup> that such should be stoned. But what do You <sup>5</sup> say?” <sup>6</sup> This they said, **testing Him**, that they might have something of which to accuse Him. But Jesus stooped down and wrote on the ground with His finger, <sup>6</sup> as though He did not hear. <sup>7</sup> So **when they continued asking Him**, He <sup>7</sup> raised Himself up and said to them, “**He who is without sin among you, let him throw a stone at her first.**” <sup>8</sup> And again He stooped down and wrote on the ground. <sup>9</sup> Then those who heard it, being <sup>9</sup> convicted by their conscience, went out one by one, beginning with the oldest even to the last. And Jesus was left alone, and the woman standing in the midst. <sup>10</sup> When Jesus had raised Himself up <sup>10</sup> and saw no one but the woman, He said to her, “Woman, where are those accusers <sup>10</sup> of yours? (Rev. 12:10) Has no one condemned you?”

<sup>11</sup> She said, “No one, Lord.” And Jesus said to her, “**Neither do I condemn you;** go <sup>11</sup> and sin no more.”

**1John 3:20-22 NKJV** “For **if our heart condemns us**, God is greater than our heart, and knows all things. <sup>21</sup> Beloved, **if our heart does not condemn us**, we have confidence toward God. <sup>22</sup> And whatever we ask we receive from Him, because we keep His commandments and do those things that are pleasing in His sight.

We all have made mistakes but God gives us the gift of repentance for us to get free. God wants a relationship with us, He is a good Father and He has provided a way by His blood for us to stay in relationship with Him. He doesn't want us to have a guilty conscious but a pure, clean, conscience.

**2 Timothy 1:3 NKJV** *"I thank God, whom **I serve with a pure conscience**, as my forefathers did, as without ceasing I remember you in my prayers night and day,"*

**1 Timothy 3:9 NKJV** *"holding the **mystery of the faith with a pure conscience**"*

**1 Timothy 1:4-6 NKJV** *"<sup>4</sup> nor give heed to fables and endless genealogies, which cause disputes rather than godly edification which is in faith. <sup>5</sup> Now the purpose of the commandment is love **from a pure heart, from a good conscience, and from <sup>6</sup>sincere faith,** <sup>6</sup> from which some, having strayed, have turned aside to idle talk,"*

**Hebrews 10:22 NKJV** *"let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, **having our hearts sprinkled from an evil conscience** and our bodies washed with pure water."*

**Hebrews 9:14 NKJV** *"how much more shall **the blood of Christ**, who through the eternal Spirit offered Himself without <sup>1</sup>spot to God, **cleanse your conscience** from dead works to serve the living God?"*

**1 John 1:7-9 NKJV** *"But **if** we walk in the light as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and **the blood of Jesus Christ** His Son cleanses us from all sin.<sup>8</sup> **If** we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. <sup>9</sup> **If** we confess our sins, **He is faithful** and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."*

To keep a good conscience, get good at this. To stay strong, keep executing your fundamentals. Keep putting God first, keep receiving forgiveness and giving forgiveness, releasing and letting go, keep giving, keep your words right, keep worshipping and going after God. **(We are avoiding shipwreck)**

**Acts 27:9-27 NKJV** *"Now when much time had been spent, and sailing was now dangerous because <sup>9</sup>the Fast was already over, **Paul advised them,** <sup>10</sup> **saying, "Men, I perceive that this voyage will end with disaster and much loss, not only of the cargo and ship, but also our lives."** <sup>11</sup> Nevertheless the centurion was more persuaded by the helmsman and the owner of the ship than by the things spoken by Paul. <sup>12</sup> And*

because the harbor was not suitable to winter in, the majority advised to set sail from there also, if by any means they could reach Phoenix, a harbor of Crete opening toward the southwest and northwest, *and winter there.*

God's kingdom is a kingdom of order and God designs leadership to help us, to protect us, to guide us, for our benefit, in the home, in the church, in the work place.

Satan wants to pervert our perception about leadership and im not saying their isn't good and bad in each category but knowing Gods heart about it and doing things God's way can protect us from danger and shipwreck.

The people on the boat didn't listen to the man of God but instead to the owner of the ship, and their buddies and it got them in trouble. People would save themselves a lot of trouble if they would do things God's way instead of theirs. **(Remember, we are avoiding shipwreck)**

**Acts 27:13-20 NKJV** *"<sup>13</sup> When the south wind blew softly, supposing that they had obtained their desire, putting out to sea, they sailed close by Crete. <sup>14</sup> But not long after, a tempestuous head wind arose, called Euroclydon. <sup>15</sup> So when the ship was caught, and could not head into the wind, we let her drive. <sup>16</sup> And running under the shelter of an island called Clauda, we secured the skiff with difficulty. <sup>17</sup> When they had taken it on board, they used cables to undergird the ship; and fearing lest they should run aground on the Syrtis Sands, they struck sail and so were driven. <sup>18</sup> And because we were exceedingly tempest-tossed, the next day they lightened the ship. <sup>19</sup> On the third day we threw the ship's tackle overboard with our own hands. <sup>20</sup> Now when neither sun nor stars appeared for many days, and no small tempest beat on us, all hope that we would be saved was finally given up."*

Think about the soft southerly wind. When you do things your way it seems like everything is okay at first, the pressure is released, it appears that every thing is going their way and they are doing good until the soft wind turns into a storm. **(We are avoiding shipwreck)**

**Ex.** Of people starting out hungry, on fire, with great potential but they aren't willing to be corrected, and if you can't be corrected, you can't be guided or led consistently by the Holy Spirit, if we aren't willing to be faithful and do things that are tough and they buy into the lie of the enemy that they should go out on their own

- Or pastor should do it this way or that way, they elevate their gifting above the offices and it doesn't work that way.

- They aren't using my gift, my anointing, so im leaving.  
These people are heading for shipwreck!

Remember Pauls shipmates didn't want to stay in the harbor because it wasn't good enough to hold them. Things weren't like they wanted so they left. They are fixing to be tossed to and fro. If you become a free sailing vessel, with no leadership, no covering, no guidance you will start off loading cargo pretty soon.

- People unload their calling, their responsibilities, their anointings, their giftings, some their spouses, etc...
- Usually you can trace it back to them not being doers of the word, not listening to the leaders God had put in their life\

People who do listen, who are coachable, teachable, direct-able they will successfully navigate through the storms of life. **(We are avoiding shipwreck)**

**Acts 27:21-29 NKJV** *"<sup>21</sup> But after long abstinence from food, then Paul stood in the midst of them and said, "**Men, you should have listened to me**, and not have sailed from Crete and incurred this disaster and loss. <sup>22</sup> And now I urge you to take heart, for there will be no loss of life among you, but only of the ship. <sup>23</sup> For there stood by me this night an angel of the God to whom I belong and whom I serve, <sup>24</sup> saying, 'Do not be afraid, Paul; **you must** be brought before Caesar; and indeed God has granted you all those who sail with you.' <sup>25</sup> Therefore take heart, men, **for I believe God** that it will be just as it was told me. <sup>26</sup> However, we must run aground on a certain island."*

*<sup>27</sup> Now when the fourteenth night had come, as we were driven up and down in the Adriatic Sea, about midnight the sailors sensed that they were drawing near some land. <sup>28</sup> And they took soundings and found it to be twenty fathoms; and when they had gone a little farther, they took soundings again and found it to be fifteen fathoms. <sup>29</sup> Then, fearing lest we should run aground on the rocks, they dropped four anchors from the stern, and prayed for day to come."*

In the middle of a storm, boatmen can let the wind drive them or they can anchor their vessel.

Everyone goes through storms but its what we do before and during that helps us navigate. Don't let what others say, or what's going on in the natural cause you to shipwreck. **(We are avoiding shipwreck)**

**Matthew 7:24-27 Ampc.** “<sup>24</sup> So everyone who **hears** these words of Mine and **acts** upon them [obeying them] will be like a <sup>ω</sup>sensible (prudent, practical, **wise**) man who built his house upon the rock.<sup>25</sup> And the rain fell and the floods came and the winds blew and beat against that house; **yet it did not fall, because** it had been founded on the rock.<sup>26</sup> And everyone who hears these words of Mine and does not do them will be like a stupid (foolish) man who built his house upon the sand.<sup>27</sup> And the rain fell and the floods came and the winds blew and beat against that house, and it fell—and great and complete was the fall of it.

When we hear and do the word (**We avoid shipwreck**)  
Be anchored, rooted, established! Avoid shipwreck.

**Hebrews 6:19,20 Ampc.** “<sup>19</sup> [Now] we have this [hope] as **a sure and steadfast anchor** of the soul [it cannot slip and **it cannot** <sup>ω</sup>**break down** under whoever steps out upon it—a hope] that reaches <sup>ω</sup>farther and enters into [the very certainty of the Presence] within the veil,

<sup>20</sup> Where Jesus has entered in for us [in advance], a Forerunner having become a High Priest forever after the order (with <sup>ω</sup>the rank) of Melchizedek.”

Jesus is the anchor of our souls. He purchased us with His blood and is the head of the church.

When we are rooted in Him we will grow up and produce fruit

**Colossians 2:6-8 Ampc.** “As you have therefore received Christ, [even] Jesus the Lord, [so] walk (regulate your lives and conduct yourselves) in union with and conformity to Him.<sup>7</sup> Have the roots [of your being] firmly and deeply **planted** [in Him, fixed and founded in Him], **being continually built up in Him, becoming increasingly more confirmed and established in the faith**, just as you were taught, and abounding and overflowing in it **with thanksgiving**.<sup>8</sup> See to it that no one carries you off as spoil or makes you yourselves captive by his so-called philosophy and intellectualism and vain deceit (idle fancies and plain nonsense), following human tradition (men’s ideas of the material rather than the spiritual world), just crude notions following the rudimentary and elemental teachings of the universe and disregarding [the teachings of] Christ (the Messiah).”

It is our responsibility to stay anchored, to not get distracted and to stay focused. It would be great to say that all Christians are committed to the things of God but its just not the case. A lot of people pull up their anchors and wreck their boats into the rocks. (**We are avoiding shipwreck**)

**1 Timothy 4:1,2,7,8 Ampc.** *"But the [Holy] Spirit distinctly and expressly declares that in latter times some will turn away from the faith, giving attention to deluding and seducing spirits and doctrines that demons teach,<sup>2</sup> Through the hypocrisy and pretensions of liars whose consciences are seared (cauterized)... But refuse and avoid irreverent legends (profane and impure and godless fictions, mere grandmothers' tales) and silly myths, and express your disapproval of them. **Train yourself toward godliness (piety), [keeping yourself spiritually fit].**<sup>8</sup> For physical training is of some value (useful for a little), but godliness (spiritual training) is useful and of **value in everything and in every way**, for it holds promise for the present life and also for the life which is to come."*

**2 Timothy 3:1-5 Ampc.** *" But understand this, that in the last days will come (set in) perilous times of great stress and trouble [hard to deal with and hard to bear]. For people will be lovers of self and [utterly] self-centered, lovers of money and aroused by an inordinate [greedy] desire for wealth, proud and arrogant and contemptuous boasters. They will be abusive (blasphemous, scoffing), disobedient to parents, ungrateful, unholy and profane. [They will be] without natural [human] affection (**callous and inhuman**), relentless (admitting of no truce or appeasement); [they will be] slanderers (false accusers, troublemakers), intemperate and loose in morals and conduct, uncontrolled and fierce, haters of good.<sup>4</sup> [They will be] treacherous [betrayers], rash, [and] inflated with self-conceit. [They will be] lovers of sensual pleasures and vain amusements more than and rather than lovers of God.<sup>5</sup> For [although] they hold a form of piety (true religion), **they deny and reject and are strangers to the power** of it [their conduct belies the genuineness of their profession]. Avoid [all] such people [turn away from them]."*

It is sad to think that their will be some Christians who will end up like this. When I see people do these things, it makes me ask for mercy because its only by His grace that we are able to stay on course as we apply His word.

**2 Timothy 4:3,4 Ampc.** *"<sup>3</sup> For the time is coming when [people] will not tolerate (endure) sound and wholesome instruction, but, having ears itching [for something pleasing and gratifying], they will gather to themselves one teacher after another to a considerable number, chosen to satisfy their own liking and to foster the errors they hold,<sup>4</sup> And **will turn aside from hearing the truth** and wander off into myths and man-made fictions."*

A good thing about God is He will help us stay on track. We can change and get back on track. He will help us make up for lost time. We can get plugged in again, get rooted again, serve, tithe, worship and one of the biggest things is to be willing and faithful. **(We are avoiding shipwreck)**

The devil is a liar and he wants you to be isolated from the things of God so he can devour you. Resist him and he will flee. Make a decision to get connected again. Get over yourself and get back in the game.

**1 Timothy 4:15 NKJV** “<sup>15</sup> Meditate on these things; **give yourself entirely to them**, that **your progress** may be evident to all.”

Meditate means keep it in your thinking all the time. Listen to what the word and the spirit are saying

Give yourself wholly to them. Devote, commit yourself to do them. Immerse yourself in them. Then your profit will be evident to all. Your progress will be evident. Your advancement will be evident. Your promotion will be evident to all and highest expectations fulfilled.

**1 Timothy 4:15,16 Message** “*Cultivate these things. **Immerse yourself in them**. The people will all see you mature right before their eyes! **Keep a firm grasp** on both your character and your teaching. **Don’t be diverted**. Just keep at it. Both you and those who hear you **will experience salvation**.”*

- Salvation- soundness, healing, provision, protection, etc..

Commit to keeping a firm grip on your faith. Commit to give ourselves to them, I will not let my faith become inactive. I will stay focused on the promises of God, I will not be distracted and I will give myself entirely to them. I will immerse myself in them and emerge victoriously!

“Give yourself entirely to them”

**1 Timothy 4:15 Ampc.** “*Practice and cultivate and meditate upon these duties; throw yourself wholly into them [as your ministry], so that your progress may be evident to everybody.”*

- evident to all.”- spread abroad; widely known;

When you hear the word, satan comes to steal it but don’t let him. The word empowers us to progress, and gain advancement and “Your progress will be evident to all” **(We are avoiding shipwreck)**



God wants us to advance, make progress, have promotions and my highest expectation fulfilled. "He wants His harvest" and He is going to use our lives to reach them.
